## **District Administration, Gurugram**

### Restrictions on Industrial & Commercial Establishments

Dated - 5th May 2020

Whereas, the COVID-19 has been declared as pandemic by the World Health Organization and National Disaster Management Authority, being satisfied that the country is threatened with the COVID-19 epidemic, has declared lockdown in the entire country. In compliance of the orders by the Govt. of Haryana from time to time, the orders of the lockdown have been issued in the territorial jurisdiction of the district Gurugram.

In compliance of the order issued by Addl. Chief Secretary Govt. of Haryana, Urban Local Bodies Department, Chandigarh memo No. ADULB/Admn/2020/26418 dated 03.05.2020 and by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India order no 40-3/2020-DM-1 (A) dated 01.05.2020 and to contain the transmission of COVID-19 disease, the orders under sections 30 and 34 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005. I, Amit Khatri, IAS, District Magistrate, Gurugram do hereby regulate the operations of the activities in the territorial jurisdiction of the district Gurugram, which are summarized as:-

- 1. The following activities will continue to remain prohibited for the period of two weeks with effect from 05.05.2020.
- All domestic and international air travel of passengers, except for medical services, air ambulance and for security purposes or for purposes as permitted by MHA.
- ii. All passenger movement by trains, except for security purposes or for purposes as permitted by MHA.
- iii. Inter-State Buses for public transport, except as permitted by MHA.
- iv. Metro rail services.
- v. Inter-State movement of individuals except for medical reasons or for activities as permitted by MHA.
- vi. All schools, colleges, educational/training/coaching institutions etc. However, online/distance learning shall be permitted.
- vii. Hospitality services other than those used for housing health/ police/ Government officials/ healthcare workers, stranded persons including tourists, and those used for quarantine facilities.
- viii. All cinema halls, shopping malls, gymnasiums, sports complexes, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars and auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.
- ix. All social/ political/ sports/ entertainment/ academic/cultural/religious functions/ other gatherings.
- x. All religious places/ places of worship shall be closed for public. Religious congregations are strictly prohibited.
- xi. Single/Multi Brand Malls/Market Complexes.
- xii. Operations of Dine-In services in all the restaurants, cafes, eateries, dhabas shall remain suspended except for take away, drive thru, home delivery services and room services in Hotels/Home stays/short terms Rentals.
- xiii. The Following movement shall be permitted with restrictions as specified:
  - a) Movement of individuals and vehicles, only for permitted activities. Four wheeler vehicles will have maximum two passengers besides the vehicle driver. For two wheelers, pillion rider is not allowed.

2. Further, during the next two weeks of Lockdown 3.0 starting from 05-05-2020, the Industrial establishments, outside Containment zone, shall be permitted to function as per State Government Directives as laid down below:-

As the District borders NCT of Delhi and District Faridabad, it is necessary to align relaxations with those given in these places to enable genuine movement of people. Though, Gurugram has been declared to fall in the "Orange" Zone by the MoH&FW, but keeping in view the high incidence of cases and the continuous unavoidable movement to and from Delhi and Faridabad "Red" Zones, restrictions applicable to a "Red" zone will be enforced in the district Gurugram as well, unless specified otherwise.

The activities which will remain operational are hereby categorized as under for the purpose of regulation:-

Any category not covered in the categories mentioned above as B, C& D may be considered to be part of the "D" category of activities as per discretion of concerned SDM's.

And whereas Municipal Corporation/Municipal Council/Municipalities have to ensure social distancing by shopkeepers as well as visitors/customers during trading activities in such markets as per Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) as mentioned in the orders.

All the Shopkeepers/Trader's Association/Market Association in tie up with MCG/MC's/Police may explore colour strip marking in front of shops for identification of category of shops (B, C & D) for staggered opening/closing of shops in such a manner that it is easy to identify the category of the shops to simplify enforcement.

All establishments shall ensure permanent paint marking outside and inside their premises. These marks shall be made 6 feet apart and it shall be ensured that persons visiting and working maintain social distancing by means of those marks. They shall also ensure that there is enough space for people to stand as per markings.

Joint Commissioner/Executive officers/Secretary of Municipal Corporation/Municipal Council/Committees and SHO (Traffic) or SHO Concerned shall identify suitable sites/locations for parking of vehicles in a staggered manner.

Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Incident Commander Sohna, Pataudi and Joint Commissioner Municipal Corporation, Gurugram to Constitute inspection teams in order to regulate the crowd in markets, maintenance of social distancing in the market and to ensure implementation of the orders.

# IT IS TO BE NOTED THAT THE ACTIVITIES ALLOWED UNDER THESE ORDERS WILL NOT BEPERMITTED IN THE CONTAINMENT ZONES.

As per National directives for COVID-19 management, the following are the lockdown measures/SOP to be complied with for public and the Work Places-

#### Measure at Work Place:-

- Wearing of face cover is compulsory in all work places and adequate stock of such face covers shall be made available.
- II. All persons in charge of work places shall ensure social distancing as per the guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, both within the work places and in company transport.
- III. Social distancing at work places shall be ensured through adequate gaps between shifts, staggering the lunch breaks of staff, etc.
- IV. Provision for thermal scanning, hand wash and sanitizer preferably with touch free mechanism will be made at all entry and exit points and common areas. In addition, sufficient quantities of handwash and sanitizer shall be made available in the work places.
- V. Frequent sanitization of entire workplace, common facilities and all points which come into human contact e.g. door handles etc., shall be ensured, including between shifts.
- VI. Persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidities, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years shall stay at home, except for meeting essential requirements and for health purposes.
- VII. Use of Arogya Setu app shall be made mandatory for all employees, both private and public. It shall be the responsibility of the Head of the respective Organizations to ensure 100% coverage of this app among the employees.
- VIII. Arrangements for transport facilities shall be ensured with social distancing, wherever personal/public transport is not feasible.

### Measures at Public Places-

- Shopkeepers as well as visitors/customers should wear gloves and masks to avoid hand contact.
- II. All persons in charge of public places and transport shall ensure social distancing as per the guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.
- III. No organization/ manager of public place shall allow gathering of 5 or more persons.
- IV. Marriages related gatherings shall ensure social distancing, and the maximum number of guests allowed shall not be more than 50.
- V. Funeral/ last rites related gatherings shall ensure social distancing, and the maximum numbers allowed shall not be more than 20.
- VI. Spitting in public places shall be punishable with fine, as may be prescribed by the State/ UT local authority.
- VII. Consumption of liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco etc. in public places is not allowed.
- VIII. Shopkeepers, Shop selling liquor, paan, gutka, tobacco etc. will ensure minimum six feet distance from each other. Proper marking of circles at the required distance should be done on regular basis so that customers/visitors shall wait for their turn and also-ensure that not more than 5 persons are present at one time at the shop.

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IX. The customers visiting these market places should not park their vehicles (both two-wheelers and four wheelers) in front of any shop/rehris but park these vehicles at parking places.

All the concerned are hereby ordered to comply with the directions above. Any violation of these instructions/orders is liable to criminal prosecution under the relevant provisions of the Disaster Management Act, 2005and punishable under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.

In view of the emergent nature of the order, it is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general this order shall come in to force with immediate effect and shall be effective up to 12:00 mid night on 17-05-2020.

This order shall be promulgated within the limits of Gurugram District through publicity van of public relations department as also by affixing of copies of this order at District, Sub Divisional & Tehsils, Courts, Public places as well as the Police Stations.
