ORDER

Whereas an order bearing no. DM/MA/2021/12485, dated: 09.06.2021 was issued by the office of undersigned whereby corona curfew was imposed in Chandigarh between 10:00 P.M. to 05:00 A.M. as a measure of isolation and social distancing to contain the spread of COVID-19 due to a lot of non-essential movement of people and vehicles during night.

Whereas, a War Room meeting was held on 15.06.2021 to review the COVID-19 situation in Chandigarh. In that meeting, it was decided that timings of corona curfew should be changed to 10:30 P.M. to 05:00 A.M. on all days.

Now, therefore, I, Mandip Singh Brar, I.A.S., District Magistrate, U.T., Chandigarh, in modification of the above mentioned order, while exercising the power vested with me u/s 144 Cr.P.C., do hereby order that **there shall be prohibition on movement of individuals/travellers for all non-essential activities between 10:30 P.M. to 05:00 A.M. in Chandigarh.** No person shall leave their homes or shall move on foot or by vehicle or travel or stand or roam around on any road or public places during above said hours.

Following categories shall be exempted:

1. Those tasked with law & order/emergency and municipal services/duties including Executive Magistrates, Police personnel, Military/C.A.P.F. personnel in uniform, health, electricity, fire, media persons with accreditation, telecom services including internet, Govt. postal services, banking and Government machinery tasked with COVID-19 related duties (all on production of Identity Card).
2. The manufacturing units/industry shall be allowed to remain open. The movement of employees/labour of manufacturing unit/industry and vehicles carrying them shall be allowed. However, concerned unit/industry shall issue them requisite permission/identity cards for the purpose and details of the same shall be shared with the Director, Industries, Chandigarh.
3. There shall be no curbs on inter-State movement of essential and non-essential goods.
4. All vehicles/persons in bonafide transit inter-State shall be allowed to pass, but only after due verification of point of origin and destination.
5. A.T.M., Hospitals, Veterinary Hospitals and all related medical establishments, including their manufacturing and distribution units, both in public and private sector, such as dispensaries, chemist, pharmacies and medical equipment shops, laboratories, pharmaceutical research labs, clinics, nursing homes, ambulance, etc. will continue to remain functional. The transportation for all medical personnel, nurses, para-medical staff, other hospital support services shall be permitted.

7. Passengers going to or returning from the airport or railway station or I.S.B.T. shall be exempted.
8. Those specially issued a restricted movement pass by the officers authorized in this behalf. Persons seeking movement pass may contact at 0172-2700076 & 0172-2700341 or apply online on www.admser.chd.nic.in/dpc. Sh. Pardhuman Singh, H.C.S. and Sh. Sanjeev Kohli, R.L.O. will be the Nodal Officers for this purpose.
9. Those Govt. employees working in tricity shall be allowed transit on production of valid identity cards and duty orders.
10. All vaccination centres/testing centres/dispensaries/medical facilities shall remain open.
11. All passes related to the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court and District Court shall be issued by the Registrar General, Punjab & Haryana High Court.


Any breach of this order shall invite action under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code.

This order shall come into force with effect from 16.06.2021 and shall remain effective till further orders.

In view of the emergent nature of the order, it is being issued ex-parte and is addressed to the public in general.

This order shall be promulgated by affixing copies thereof at the notice boards of the office of the undersigned as well as District Courts and publication in the newspapers having circulation in the area, through the office of the D.P.R., Chandigarh.
